85 percent of Gazans report deterioration in economic conditions and Palestinians are divided over negotiations

The Arab World for Research and Development (AWRAD) conducted a national public opinion poll April 7-10, 2018 among 1,200 Palestinians (18+) in the West Bank and Gaza Strip. The poll focused on the following issues: Living conditions, the peace process, evaluation of leaders, elections, and political party support. Living Conditions Worsening, but Optimism Remains: Since the previous year, Palestinians believe that both personal and national circumstances have deteriorated. 56 percent believe their family's economic situation has worsened (85 percent in Gaza and 37 percent in the West Bank). Further, 58 percent believe that Palestine is headed in the wrong direction (71 percent in Gaza and 50 percent in the West Bank). Despite these adverse conditions, hope remains with 50 percent of Palestinians expressing optimism for the future (43 percent in Gaza and 56 percent in the West Bank).

Opposition to Dissolution of PA: Over two-thirds (68 percent) of respondents oppose the dissolution of the Palestinian Authority. Opposition to dissolution has increased by 8 points since a similar poll conducted in October 2016. West Bank (70 percent) respondents are more likely to object than those in Gaza (65 percent). Opposition increases to 80 percent if dissolution were to result in administration by the Israeli Occupation.

Perception of Corruption is Widespread: Across the country, a large majority of Palestinians (80 percent) believe corruption exists in their governing institutions.

Hamas Considered in Control of Gaza: The vast majority (90 percent) of respondents believe Hamas, defined as its political and military wings, is the actor in control of the internal situation in Gaza. Only 8 percent identify the PA and the Hamdallah government.

Palestinians Divided on Negotiations, Supportive of Abbas Approach: Palestinians are split on the resumption of peace talks, with 44 percent expressing support and 48 percent expressing opposition. However, the approach of Abbas, predicated on negotiations, is most popular; 42 percent express support for this approach, compared to 19 percent who prefer Hamas leader Haniyeh's.

Majority Supports Return to Armed Conflict: 57 percent of Palestinians support a renewal of armed conflict at the present time. Respondents in Gaza are most supportive, with three-quarters (76 percent) expressing affirmation. In contrast, those in the West Bank are divided, while 45 percent are supportive, 47 percent express opposition. Compared to October 2016, support for a

return to armed conflict has increased by 7 points overall and by 28 points in Gaza. Despite majority support, respondents are more skeptical of the efficacy of armed conflict. 43 percent believe a renewal would benefit Palestinians, while 30 percent believe it would benefit only to some extent.

Palestinians are Divided about Leaders: If elections for PA President were held today and 10 leaders nominated themselves, Abbas receives only one-fifth (21 percent) of the popular vote, followed by Marwan Barghouthi (16 percent), Ismail Haniyeh (11 percent) and Mohammad Dahlan (7 percent). In the Gaza Strip, the four leaders are equally popular (receiving 15-17 percent each). All other leaders (Salam Fayyad, Mustafa Barghouti, Khaled Mshaal, Ahmad Saadat, Rami Hamdallah, and Ramadan Shallah) received 1-3 percent general support.

In general, however, the greatest plurality (32 percent) of respondents indicates that they are undecided (10 percent) or would not vote (22 percent).

46 percent do not support any political party: Fatah continues to be the most popular political party (34 percent), followed by Hamas (14 percent). All other political parties received 1-2 percent.
